

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The following article was printed in the newsletter several years ago. Now with the COVID-19 pandemic and the isolation and idle time it brings, I think it is worth introducing it again. Being idle is harmful to physical, mental and spiritual wellbeing, and the Lord would have us always using both mind and body to maintain optimum health. During unemployment or retirement, a hobby or pastime that requires the simultaneous use of both physical and mental abilities has been found to be most beneficial in developing and preserving cognitive and motor skills.

Working with one's hands is becoming increasingly rare in today's society. This is not only true for adults but for children as well. Studies have found that, in terms of cognitive and conceptual development, an 11-year-old today is performing at the level an 8-9-year-old was performing at 30 years ago. It has been proposed that the most likely reasons are the lack of experiential play in primary schools, and the growth of a video game, TV culture. Both take away the kind of

hands-on play that allows kids to experience how the world works in practice and to make informed judgments about abstract concepts.

Psychologist and biologist, Dr. Aric Sigman notes that "working with one's own hands in a real world three dimensional environment is imperative for full cognitive and intellectual development."

It has been found that the cortical thickness of the frontal lobe in young adult brains is thinner in those who had toys that taught them about colors, numbers or letters, and thicker in those who played with real or toy musical instruments.

The left brain hemisphere is sometimes referred to as the digital brain. It controls reading and writing, calculation, and logical thinking. The right brain hemisphere is referred to as the analog brain. It controls three-dimensional sense, creativity, and artistic senses. When one is working with the hands on real three-dimensional objects, both hemispheres are intricately involved.

Senior engineers and car mechanics have noted a recent and noticeable decline in the ability of junior engineers and apprentice mechanics to conceptualize straightforward mechanical problems. The young people concerned had more than enough intelligence but they seemed to have missed certain areas of cognitive development because "they hadn't held a wrench or tinkered with a simple engine".

Research from unrelated diverse disciplines clearly indicates that craft activities cultivate precisely the cognitive and physical experiences necessary for full intellectual development. For example, making pottery, knitting, wood-working and gardening all involve practical hand-craft and aesthetic skills, along with knowledge of the physical properties of the material been worked.

Gardening, as one example, is a wonderful way to get plenty of exercise while using the mind to plan, arrange, cultivate and feed a variety of flowers, fruits and vegetables. An extra bonus, if done skillfully, is that one gets to reap what one sows.

Interesting findings from related studies have shown that even cursive (long hand) writing skill is a process that needs an integration of visual, motor, as well as cognitive or perceptive parts. The perception allows one to remember the shape of the letters that are written while sight and motor skills of the hand enable the writing. Just sitting and writing a letter in long hand is an exercise that helps keeps the brain in shape. Typing does not activate the brain in such a beneficial way. You will find your hands a little shaky and unsure in writing out

a letter in longhand, if you have been typing exclusively for a while.

As we age, working with the hands seems to become less common. But to maintain mental and physical health, it would be good from time to time to put down the crossword puzzle or the remote and go work in the garden, or pick up the knitting needles, or play a musical instrument, or tinker in the garage or shop.

It is noteworthy that Jesus' youth was spent as a

Current Events and What do we do Now! Melissa Derfler

Much has happened in the last month. Anarchy in cities, fires, hurricanes, and signs all around us show that Jesus is coming soon!

"In recent events we can sense His approaching footsteps. We are living in the time of the end...The days in which we live are solemn and important. The Spirit of God is gradually but surely being withdrawn from the earth. Plagues and judgments are already falling upon the despisers of the grace of God. The calamities by land and sea, the unsettled state of society, the alarms of war, are portentous. They forecast approaching events of the greatest magnitude. The agencies of evil are combining their forces and consolidating. They are strengthening for the last great crisis. Great changes are soon to take place in our world, and the final movements will be rapid ones." 9T 11

An active hurricane season is underway in the south, while wildfires have waged unprecedented destruction across the western US, tearing through idyllic mountain towns, forcing more than 40,000 Oregon evacuations, reducing neighborhoods to ash, and spewing smoke that has lowered air quality levels to "worst in the world" ratings (i.e. Portland). Phoenix and Talent are substantially destroyed. In spite of the COVID-19 pandemic, evacuees crowd into shelters.

As I write this, the Glass fire is raging in St. Helena, California, near Pacific Union College, the St. Helena Sanitarium, and Ellen White's Elmshaven home, which prompted Pastor Ted Wilson to request special prayer from our members to avert destruction of these areas.

Firefighters struggle to contain blazes that have consumed nearly five million acres of the Pacific Northwest, in a record-setting made worse, scientists say, by the climate change caused by the burning of fossil fuels like coal and oil.

Alongside ominous photographs of orange skies, the front page of the Sunday Los Angeles Times blared: "California's Climate Apocalypse." Gov. Gavin Newsom of California concurred, claiming that serious droughts and record-breaking heat waves were undeniable evidence that many of the most dire predictions about climate change had already arrived. Anyone who thinks differently, he insists, is in denial.

Bjorn Lomborg, whose article "Sorry, Solar Panels

Won't Stop California's Fires" appeared in the New York Post Sept. 14, 2020, disagrees with the current narrative. He authored the New York Times bestselling, compelling and "superbly argued" book "False Alarm: How Climate-Change Panic Costs Us Trillions, Hurts the Poor, and Fails to Fix the Planet, in it stating that "the rhetoric on climate change has become ever more extreme and less moored to the actual science", with the media becoming increasingly irrational. He argues that "even if the entire United States were to cut all its emissions tomorrow and for the rest of the century – an incredibly fanciful and enormously expensive assumption - temperatures would still climb, just 0.3 degrees F less. Fires would still get worse, only slightly less." The obsession with climate change, he says, blaming everything from pandemics and food shortages to political strife and conflicts on climate change, is making us increasingly ignore other challenges which need to be addressed. He says we need "to dial back on the panic, look at the science, face the economics, and address the issue rationally." Not what's happening on the world front!

With a "new sense of urgency, the Vatican launched a year-long program of Laudato Si' activities and put in place a new, seven-year call to action." The encyclical 'Laudato Si' motivated many people to take action on global warming, but governments, the Pope said, have lagged far behind. "The encyclical broadly accepts the scientific consensus that climate change is principally a man-made phenomenon. Without prompt global action to reduce carbon dioxide emissions and slow the planet's warming, it says, there will be profound environmental, social, political, and economic consequences." (Inside Climate News, Aug 7, 2020). Apparently, the Pope plans to save the planet by introducing Sunday laws. He claims that Catholics are fully committed to saving our common home.

"In some ways, the current pandemic has led us to rediscover simpler and sustainable lifestyles," Pope Francis said in a written message. "Already we can see how the Earth can recover if we allow it to rest. The air becomes cleaner, the waters clearer, and animals have returned to many places from where they had previously disappeared."

"The pandemic has brought us to a crossroads," he wrote, issuing his appeal to mark the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. (Doug Batchelor, "How the Pope Plans to Save the Planet", Sept. 4, 2020)

A growing chorus of voices are calling for Sunday laws. For example, Mayor Cam Guthrie, politican from Guelph, Ontario, Canada, tweeted on March 21: "Just putting this out there for consideration: Once we kick Covid-19's butt, I'd suggest that everything be closed on Sundays again so that we can appreciate the importance of what taking a pause in our busy lives really means. I think our body, mind and soul would thank us."

"The truth about the claim that 'the Pope is about to enforce Sunday Law' is that the seat of Papacy is

indeed trying to implement Sunday law because Sunday is her supposed "mark" of authority/power over divine times and laws in order to reestablish **UNIVERSAL Papal** Supremacy under the leadership of the Jesuit Order (Pope Francis is a Jesuit who kept his silver cross). "Therefore, also in the particular circumstances of our own time, Christians will naturally

strive to ensure that civil

legislation respects their duty to keep Sunday holy." (John Paul II, Dies Domini, 1998)

"In respecting **religious liberty** and the common good of all, Christians should seek recognition of **Sundays** and the Church's holy days as **legal holidays**." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2188) -Martin White, theology writer on *Quora*, 9-1-20

The line between church and state is getting increasingly blurry. Attorney General William Barr recently stated that "secularists have attempted to drive religion from the public square and to exclude religious people from bringing a religious perspective to bear on conversations about the common good... Separation of church and state", said Barr, "does not mean – and never did mean – separation of religion and civics." He went on to say that he is "witnessing small, but significant steps" towards the restoration of religion to its proper role in America. William Barr, a Roman Catholic, was honored at the National Catholic Prayer Breakfast, lauded as a "Catholic Public Servant", and chosen to receive the Christifidelis Laici Award, which honors lay Catholics who promote the New

Evangelization and **the Church's mission** in their life **and work**. What is William Barr's work? He is the Attorney General of our country.

"The Roman Catholic Church, with all its ramifications throughout the world, forms one vast organization under the control, and designed to serve the interests, of the papal see. Its millions of communicants, in every country on the globe, are instructed to hold themselves as bound in allegiance to the pope. Whatever their nationality or their government, they are to regard the authority of the church as above all other. Though they may take the oath pledging their loyalty to the state, yet back of this lies the vow of obedience to Rome, absolving them from every pledge inimical to her interests." GC 580

Interestingly, "Roman Catholics account for a bit more than 20% of the U.S. population, yet they are on track to hold six of the Supreme Court's nine seats now that **President Donald** Trump has nominated Amy Coney Barrett to fill its vacancy." (Associated Press Sep 26, 2020) "That the State

must be separated from the Church," said Pope Pius in *Vehementer Nos*, "is a thesis absolutely false, a most pernicious error."

In his historic speech of Sep 12, 1960, presidential candidate John F. Kennedy had stated, "I believe in an America where the separation of church and state is absolute, where no Catholic prelate would tell the president (should he be Catholic) how to act, and no Protestant minister would tell his parishioners for whom to vote; where no church or church school is granted any public funds or political preference; and where no man is denied public office merely because his religion differs from the president who might appoint him or the people who might elect him.

"I believe in an America that is officially neither Catholic, Protestant nor Jewish; where no public official either requests or accepts instructions on public policy from the Pope, the National Council of Churches or any other ecclesiastical source; where no religious body seeks to impose its will directly or indirectly upon the general populace or the public acts of its officials; and where religious liberty is so indivisible that an act against one church is treated as an act against all."





Are we ready for Jesus to come? Do we know His voice when He speaks to us through the Holy Spirit? Is our faith strong so that we will be able to stand the trials that are ahead?

I thought about how important it is to know God's voice, now and in the future. Satan is going about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour, destroying our safety net. He is trying at this very moment to break our connection with our Heavenly Father so that we cannot survive the onslaught that is before us. He is after us individually and corporately as a church.

He feeds on our anger, sadness and discouragement, and uses our emotions against us. He and his demonic angels study us carefully and kick us when we are down and lay traps for us. "If we would labor to repress sinful thoughts and feelings, giving them no expression in words or actions, Satan would be defeated...but how often do professed Christians open the door to the adversary of souls!... As soon as an alienation of feeling arises, the matter is spread before Satan for his inspection. (No wonder we fail so often!) There is great loss in every dissension. A house divided against itself cannot stand." RH 3/22/1887

"The church (and each person) must rouse to action. The Spirit of God can never come in until she prepares the way. There should be earnest searching of heart. There should be united, persevering prayer, and through faith a claiming of the promises of God. We must work fast and go steadily forward." (ibid)

But without faith, we are toast.

Without faith it is impossible to please Him, but with faith, we can do all things through Christ who strengthens us.

As I contemplated the importance of faith, I thought of Ellen White's vision. In it she saw people on a path to heaven, but near the end, the path disappeared. There was only a cord hanging down, and each person had to hang onto the cord to get to heaven.

Thinking about this, I remember movies I saw on TV as a child about Tarzan, and how he would swing through the trees by hanging onto a rope. He made it look so easy. He would even jump to the rope, hang on and swing to where he wanted to go. I wondered how much practice it took to be able to do that. How long did it take to develop the muscles to hang on? Did he fall sometimes and hurt himself? Did he ever get rope burns? Did he worry about if the rope would break?

To have faith, we must practice using it, and that's no fun. We might fall and get hurt or get burned emotionally. It is easy to have faith when we don't need it, but when life doesn't make sense, and it appears that God isn't with us, then faith is really tested. If we have learned to recognize His voice, we will not be discouraged. We will believe that He is by our side and has allowed things to happen for a reason. We will verbalize our faith in God, as we hear Him speaking to our hearts, "Never give up! This is the way. Walk ye in it." Then we will build spiritual muscle and confidence in Him. Then we can take the leap of faith, grab hold of God's rope and swing our full weight on it. Then we are ready for Jesus to come. ~Gloria Wilson

God is love. (Read in I John 4:8).





There is another ministry that has become very dear to their hearts over the years called Pregnancy Care Center of Grants Pass. It was started over 30 years ago by a group of people concerned about teen pregnancy and those facing challenging pregnancy decisions.

Jon volunteered to work with this organization over 10 years ago and within a few months he was asked to join them as their medical director. This faith-based pro-life outreach provides free services to over 3,000 people annually. They offer hope and options to those facing crucial decisions during a stressful time in their lives. Their services cover a wide range from basic ultrasounds

to abortion recovery (a program called "Journey"). "Epic" is a program provided to middle school and high school students about abstinence and making wise choices about sex and healthy relationships. Their mission is to offer information and support to help each person make the best decision for themselves, and those who are close to them.

They never charge for any of their services. The Pregnancy Care Center operates on donations through the generosity of corporate and private sponsors, and people like you and me. While not everyone is able to give a monetary donation, there are many other ways to get involved, From volunteering one's time for needed tasks to being on their prayer team. Jon and Anna feel that helping with this much needed service is a great opportunity for them to show other Christians that Adventists are not exclusive and we care about those who are in need.

The annual Gala is the center's primary fund raiser and this year COVID-19 has drastically changed the way that they will do that. But that is not a bad thing! In normal years, the Gala is held over three evenings and is limited by the venue to a total of approximately 750 benefactors. Since this year's Gala will be held virtually there is no limit to the number of people who can "attend". There is no charge to sign up or watch the presentation and it will still be held over a three evening span (Oct. 8, 9, 10). This is a great way to find out more about the different programs that the Pregnancy Care Center offers and see if it's something that you feel led to become involved with. 

ON A JOURNEY OF GRACE

I'm on a journey. That journey is to discover the true nature of grace. What is grace according to the Bible? Where does it come from? How do I get God's grace? What part do I play in grace? In my last sermon of September, I not only talked about some of my findings but also left on my Pastor's Blog the link to my worksheet of initial findings.

After reading through the 159 verses in the Bible containing the word grace, and reading the devotional book written by Ellen White entitled Amazing Grace, I have come to realize I've been somewhat ignorant about what grace is and what grace can be in my life as well as the lives of my church family.

My computer dictionary states: (under "Christian belief") grace is the free and unmerited favor of God, as manifested in the salvation of sinners and the bestowal of blessings. This is completely true. Grace is unmerited or undeserved favor. We see that clearly in verses like these.

- "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Rom 5:8 NIV
- "Even when we were dead through our trespasses, [God] made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved)." Eph 2:5 RSV
- "For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God..." Eph 2:8 KJV

From my exhaustive reading of the texts on grace, I can say the second part of the dictionary quote is also true. "...the bestowal of blessings." EVERY gift that comes from God is a gift of grace. His mercy, His kindness, His goodness that leads us to repentance, and yes even repentance itself is a grace bestowed on us. That truth is made evident in verses like these.
